A Word of Guidance from Thomas Louis Brown, Sr., Bishop

Greetings clergy and laity of the Sixth Episcopal District!

The COVID-19 is mysteriously impacting our lives in ways we could have never imagined. While the virus is mysterious, it is not a myth. It is real! This crisis is affecting our homes, churches, communities, schools, jobs and lives all around the globe. The word crisis means a turning point – a moment of both danger and opportunity. - · Let us ensure that our people's spiritual and material needs are being met. Especially attend to the needs of our children and youth as well as the elderly in our congregations, and those who may become victims of this virus.

Now, given the COVID-19 crisis, the Sixth District's Spring meeting, scheduled for April 3-4, 2020, has been revised. Instead, I will host a Sixth Episcopal District "Spring TeleGathering" via Zoom on Saturday, April 4th from 8:30 a.m. to 12 Noon. You will receive further instructions and training information about that event.

The One-In-The-Spirit Banquet, scheduled for April 4, has been cancelled. My commitment remains to use 40% of the funds raised to help assist our local churches, utilizing the Presiding Elders as the medium through which this is done.
